Report of the Committee on Missions, Circuits and Stations

The Louisville District

The Louisville District is composed of 11 churches. After consultation with Presiding Elder, Reverend William W. The Lexington District

The Lexington District is composed of 26 churches. After consultation with Reverend William Hale and Reverend Jermaine Wilson on behalf of Presiding Elder James E. Smith of the Lexington District, the Committee on Missions, Circuits, and Stations recommends that all of the following churches retain station status with the exception of Perkins Chapel, Wilmore, which will remain as a Mission; and the committee acknowledges the will of St. Andrews Winchester to dissolve and recommend it be so, and that the congregant(s) be merged with another church within the ensuring conference year.
